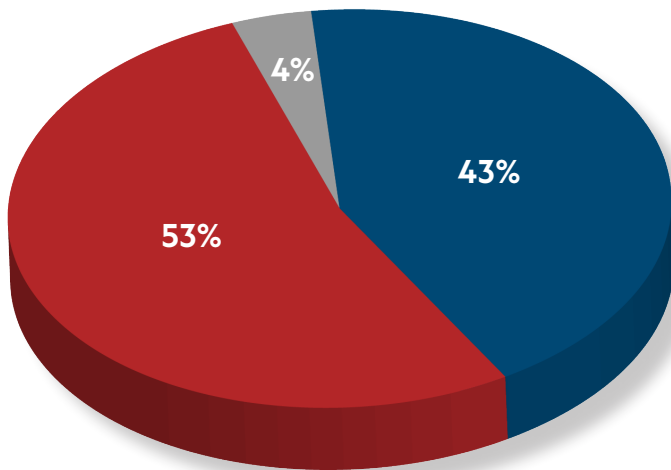

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

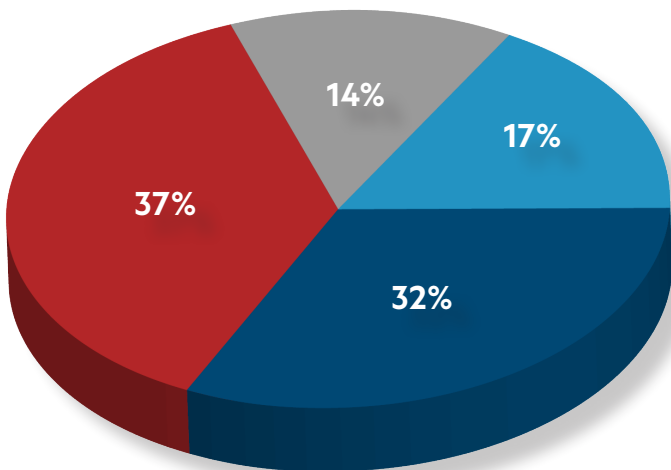
Since 1994, when the Brain Aneurysm Foundation was established as a public charity, our funding has been targeted to provide critical awareness, education, support, advocacy, and research funding to reduce the incidence of brain aneurysms, promote early detection, and improve patient outcomes.

The foundation has no endowment. Every dollar we raise is deployed to advance our mission to create wider awareness of brain aneurysms; to provide support for those affected by brain aneurysms; and to educate patients, their families, and the medical community about brain aneurysms. From year to year, the foundation strives to maintain its low overhead through vigilant governance of expenses and constant review of nonprofit best practices and methodologies.

RESEARCH

Each year, the Brain Aneurysm Foundation awards grants for research focused on early detection, improved treatments, and technological advances that will ultimately improve the outcomes for patients with brain aneurysms.

In 2019, the Brain Aneurysm Foundation awarded \$505,000 in research grants to 14 recipients, the largest amount awarded in one year to date. Since its inception, the foundation — the largest private funder of brain aneurysm research in the nation — has distributed more than \$3.2 million in research grants.

The Research Grant Committee is led by the foundation's Medical Advisory Board president Robert Rosenwasser, MD, of Thomas Jefferson University Hospital. The committee reviews all grant applications to identify those of the greatest merit that align with the foundation's mission.

In 2019 the Brain Aneurysm Foundation (BAF) continued collaboration with DBC Pri-Med LLC to educate primary care physicians (PCP) to help them identify the early warning signs and symptoms of a brain aneurysm rupture. This first of its kind educational webcast launched in January of 2019 and will be shown through early 2020. Plans for three to four live lectures in 2020 have also been set in place.

Accurate early diagnosis is critical, as the initial hemorrhage may be fatal or result in devastating neurologic outcomes. Despite widespread neuroimaging availability, a misdiagnosis or delayed diagnosis occurs in up to 25 percent of patients with a subarachnoid hemorrhage when initially seeking medical treatment. Failure to do a scan results in 73 percent of these misdiagnoses.

Primary care physicians are often the first line of defense. However, the presence of a brain aneurysm can be difficult to detect. Symptoms can present as stress or pain related. Physicians may be inclined to recommend yoga or prescribe pain medicine, rather than send their patient for a life-saving head scan. Knowledge is power, which is why the webcast is a critical opportunity to increase the level of awareness among the medical community and save lives.

After completing the webcast, participants were asked to describe a specific change they intend to make in their practices. Below are some of the responses — a clear indication that the webcast is increasing awareness among the medical community.



Deeper exploration of headache complaints while being more conscientious of the possibility of an aneurysm.



Maintain high index of suspicion for early (initial) presentation of subacute SAH. Also begin screening family members with known family history, if not already done.



I am now more able to stratify risk for aneurysm among patients I see. Based on this, I will be better at screening high-risk candidates.



I now have an improved understanding of current diagnosis & management of aneurysms and how decisions are made so I can help patients calm some of their anxiety.



I feel better prepared to make a decision on a patient who presents with a severe new onset headache now. The information was abundant for the period allocated to the lecture. The lecturer was superb in both subject matter and presentation.



Capitol Hill

At Advocacy Day in March, over 120 people from 23 different states joined the Brain Aneurysm Foundation on Capitol Hill – the best attendance to date! As a result of our efforts on the hill, the Senate established September as National Brain Aneurysm Awareness Month.

Ellie's Law

“Ellie’s Law” is a bipartisan bill introduced by Reps. Yvette Clarke (D-NY) and Peter King (R-NY) (H.R. 594) and Sen. Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) (S. 864) and was drafted in consultation with members of the brain aneurysm medical and research communities. Ellie’s Law would provide the first ongoing dedicated research funding stream for breakthroughs in preventing potentially fatal brain aneurysms from rupturing and improving the long-term medical consequences and quality of life issues for aneurysm survivors. Now is the time to address this critical issue by adequately funding brain aneurysm research.

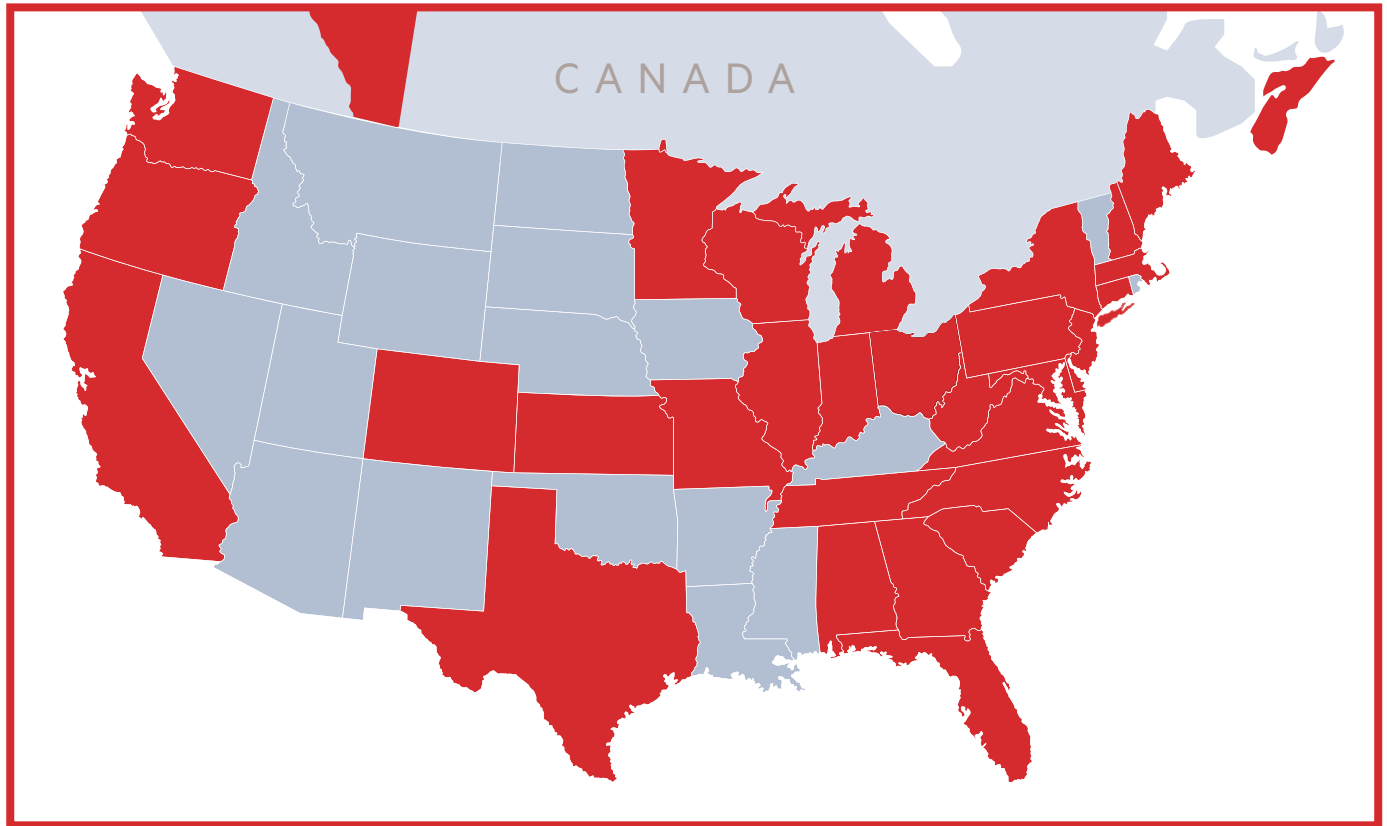
In 2019 Ellie’s Law gained bipartisan support in the House and Senate and continued to gain co-sponsors.

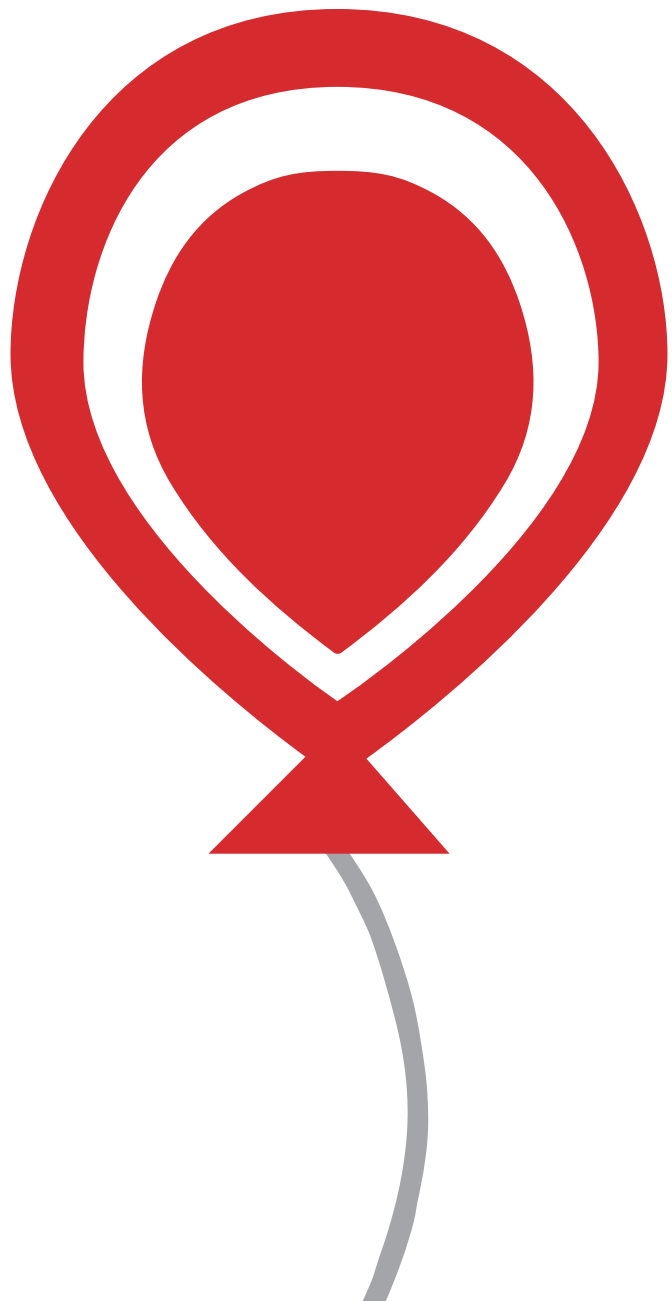

In honor of our 25th Anniversary, in August of 2019 we launched our **STOP the POP** campaign aimed at raising awareness and education to help save lives. For the campaign we garnered ambassadors from all 50 states to help us raise awareness and provide education on brain aneurysms.

The campaign uses a red balloon to identify a brain aneurysm and the popping of a balloon, a rupture. This symbolically illustrates how a life can change in an instant.

By the end of the year, we gained over 400 Stop the Pop state ambassadors and raised more that \$20,000.

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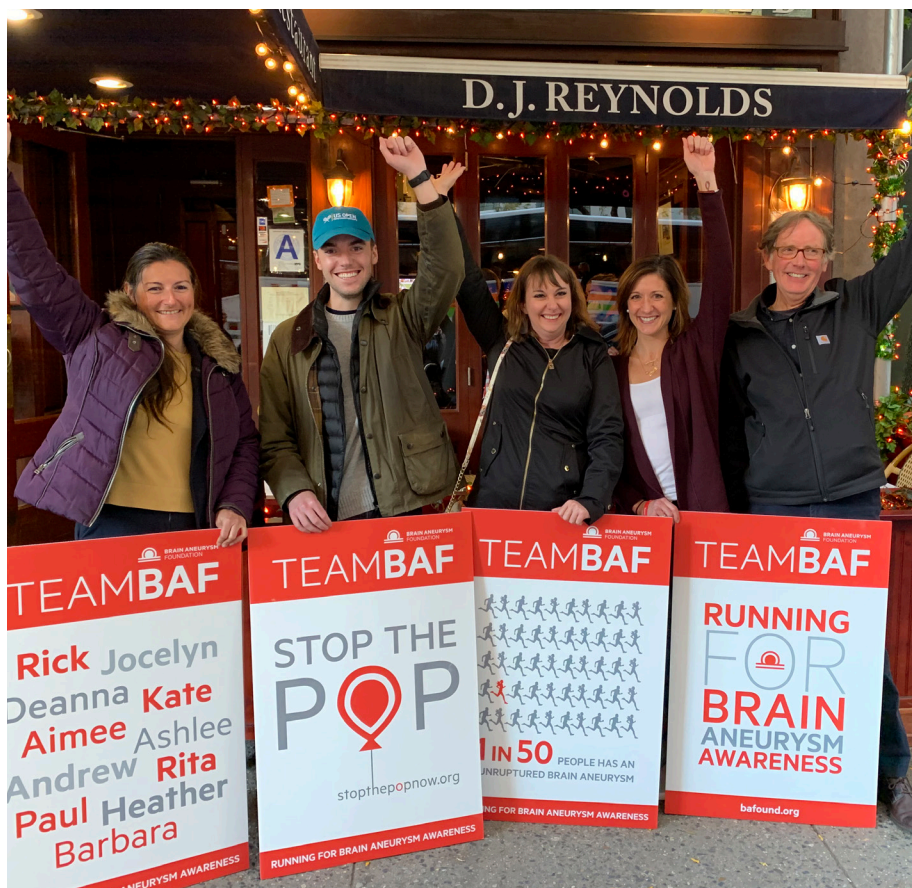
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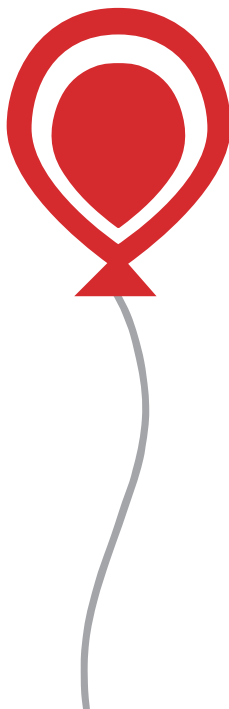
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
